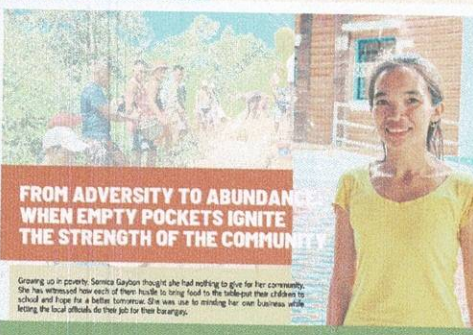
### KALAHI-CIDSS PAMANA IP-CDD

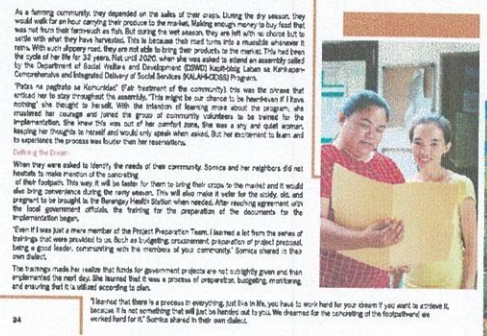

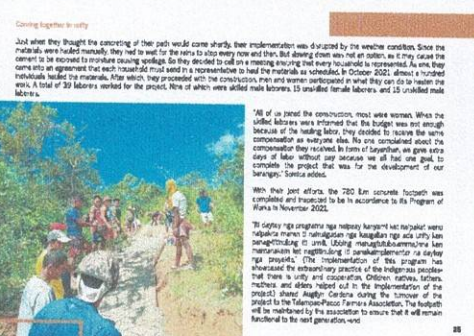


### FROM ADVERSITY TO ABUNDANCE WHEN EMPTY POCKETS IGNITE THE STRENGTH OF THE COMMUNITY

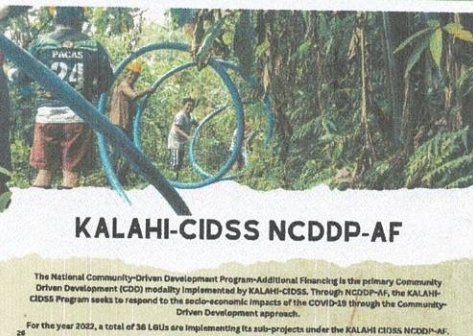

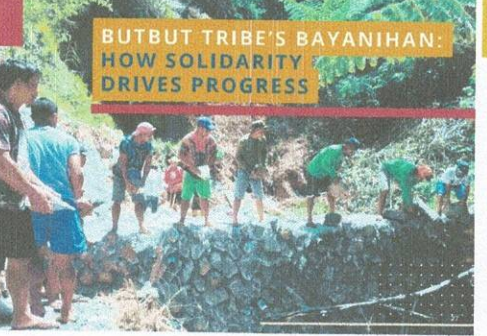

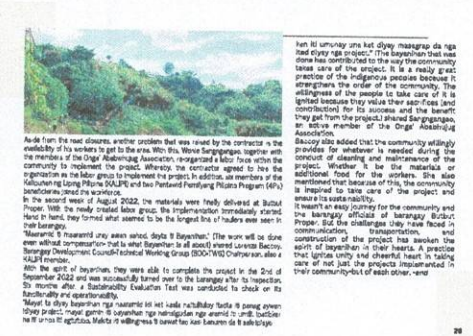


### BUTBUT TRIBE'S BAYANIHAN: HOW SOLIDARITY DRIVES PROGRESS

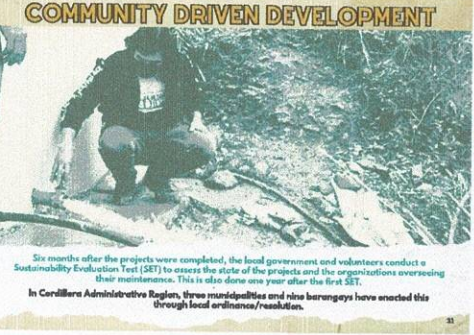

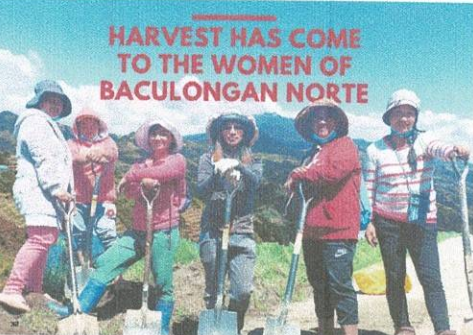


### COMMUNITY DRIVEN DEVELOPMENT

**It allows communities to maximize limited resources by prioritizing their most pressing needs.**

**WHY INSTITUTIONALIZE?**  
CDD will complement the local Government Code by providing mechanisms to operationalize and sustain self-reliant communities through a proven system of informing, developing, and harnessing constituents to become resilient.

Kapuhapag-Laban sa Kapuhapag-Comprehensive and Integrated Delivery of Social Services (KALAHI-CIGSS) has been championing CDD for over 15 years. Through CDD, KALAHI has demonstrated success in poverty alleviation, community empowerment, and participatory local governance across the country.

### INSTITUTIONALIZING THE PRINCIPLES OF CDD

**PARTICIPATION**  
Institutionalizing CDD requires a means to engage:

- Community elites/leaders
- Community-based organizations
- Community-based practitioners
- Community-based organizations and
- Community-based practitioners and evaluators

**TRANSPARENCY**  
The creation, implementation, monitoring, and review of CDD projects is a transparent and accountable process. It is a key to operationalizing and sustaining CDD in the long term.

**ACCOUNTABILITY**  
Community members engage in monitoring and evaluation of projects. They are empowered to identify and solve concrete action items. Accountability is a key to operationalizing and sustaining CDD in the long term.

### ENACTING THE CDD BILL

Our proposed CDD Bill will feature the following:

1. Institutionalization and operationalization of the CDD approach as a national strategy for disaster prevention and relief.
2. Creation of an Interagency Advisory Council on CDD Institutionalization for policy development.
3. Mandate of the Department of Social Welfare and Development as the lead agency for CDD institutionalization and implementation.
4. Mandate of the Department of Social Welfare and Development to conduct research and development of the CDD approach.

**OPERATIONALIZATION OF THE CDD APPROACH**

The CDD Bill enables community members to participate in the development, implementation, monitoring, and review of CDD projects.

**DEVELOPMENT**  
Development involves the identification of community needs, the formulation of a development plan, and the mobilization of resources to implement the plan.

**IMPLEMENTATION**  
Implementation involves the execution of the development plan, the monitoring and evaluation of the project, and the reporting of progress to the community.

**MONITORING AND EVALUATION**  
Monitoring and evaluation involves the regular assessment of the project's progress, the identification of problems, and the implementation of corrective actions.




