- 3. All entries must be typewritten/printed/longhand. Any erasure in the quotation must be countersigned by the bidder/representative, otherwise quotation will be rejected.
- 4. The Procuring Entity may give due preference to goods being offered with green component.
 5. It necessary, the BAC through the TWG, may require an occurar inspection of the venue/place of business/goods being offered
- 6. Delivery of Goods / Services is as indicated in the next page.
- 7. Price validity shall be for a period of 120 calendar days from RFQ Opening of the BAC until confirmation of Purchase Order by the winning supplier.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR PSYCHIATRIC CONSULTATIONS

Background

Women and child abuse is a pressing concern that the Philippines is currently facing. With the increasing number of referrals to the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) for the victims' security and protection, it is the country's responsibility to be aware and involved in addressing said issue. In order to protect said disadvantaged group, the government implemented Republic Act No. 9262 otherwise known as the "Anti-Violence Against Women and their Children Act of 2004" which values the dignity of women and children and guarantees full respect for human rights. The State also recognizes the need to protect the family and its members particularly women and children, from violence and threats to their personal safety and security.

As a result of the traumatic experiences encountered by the RHWG clients/residents, psychiatric impacts are usually observed among them. As such, the need for psychiatric consultations are essential vis-à-vis the Psychological Services being provided and for possibilities medications which might be

prescribed.

II. Objective for Engaging into Psychological Assessment and Psychotherapeutic Sessions

With the services of the provider, the residents are provided timely and appropriate psychological interventions.

III. Scope of the Work

The service provider shall conduct the following:

- psychiatric assessment/diagnosis with in-depth sessions consultation meeting/conference with the staff assigned under psychological services (if available)
- recommend psychiatric interventions and other procedures to be observed relative to the referral symptoms
- prescribe necessary medications and therapeutic sessions based on assessment/diagnosis
- 25 target residents

IV. Arrangement

- Service Provider: Provides services as stated in the scope of work.
- Regional Haven for Women and Girls

The staff assigned under the Psychological Services shall:

- Set an appointment with the service provider on behalf of the residents;
- b. Clarify/inquire about the findings and recommendations of the service provider;
- Provide feedback to the center-based rehabilitation team regarding the psychological interventions to address the psychological issues of the resident;
- d. Collaborate with other professionals/service providers offering services needed as recommended; and



e. Ensure psychiatric feedback reports of residents are furnished to the center.

٧. Payment and Schedule

The service provider shall be paid with the quoted rate per consultation which is within the allotted budget based on the approved project proposal. The payment is inclusive of appropriate taxes and other incidental expenses which may be incurred in the course of the engagement. The payment shall be made after five (5) working days upon the date of the residents' consultation/s
